National Heritage Area



The Mountains to Sound Greenway National Heritage Area encompasses over 1.5 million acres of connected natural lands and vibrant urban areas surrounding I-90 between Puget Sound and Central Washington. The Greenway conserves a shared heritage of working farms and forests, parks, sustainable communities and abundant outdoor educational and recreational opportunities. This map illustrates the impressive history of public land conservation in the Mountains to Sound Greenway. The checkerboard pattern in the Cascades reveals decades of concerted effort to return 19th century railroad land grants back to public ownership.
